



Steps you must follow for license transfer

To have your license transfer to Florida, you must follow the following steps



Choosing of the state

You must first select a state in which you can transfer and then go through the board of the nurses to understand whether they allow the transfer or not. If they do, then you can get the endorsement application form.

You can always visit the online Nursys licensure verification website to obtain the verification to work in another state.



Board does a background check

When you have filed your application to the in-question board, the board will accept your application, and they will make sure that you are eligible for the work permit in that state.

They will surely check all the data, and they will make sure that all the information you provide is either true or not.

You must be carrying a valid and active nursing license from your home state.

Your work report from the previous workplaces holds much importance. As they provide your authenticity and professionalism proof.



Fee payment

You must submit your fee for endorsement according to the law. It is usually \$110 in Florida. But again, every state has its own endorsement fees, and you must submit it to proceed any further.



Final word from the board

You must know that the final word is from the board of nurses. If they are satisfied with your application and your background check, then you will get your nursing license for the state you have applied in. Otherwise, your application will get rejected.

Always remember that usually, it takes 1 to 2 months of the period before you get notified about the license. So, you must not worry about the time delay.

Time delay happens only because of the workload and in the process of attaining all the possible information before granting you the license.

After you have received your license, you are permitted by the state to work freely under new state's laws. You must follow the new state's laws.
